A few guidelines: <u>Do not cut</u> stamps off airmail, war time mail, old mail, or first day covers. <u>Do not</u> separate 2 by 2 stamps (block) or a line of 4 stamps or se-tenants*.

Do leave at least ½ inch of paper around the stamps when cutting stamps off other envelopes, *several small stamps when put together make one large stamp, usually a special picture; see catalog p.75, lower left.

Many Seniors who want to attend these programs do not have transportation.

A few Seniors provide rides. More are needed. Let us know if you can help.
